

Amsterdam & Region Travel Ticket

The Amsterdam & Region Travel Ticket entitles you to unlimited travel in Amsterdam and its whole region -day and night- on bus, tram, metro and train. The ticket is valid for 1, 2 or 3 calendar days from first check in. A day in this context begins at 0:00 AM and ends the next day at 4:00 AM. With this ticket you always check in when boarding and check out when getting off the bus or tram. For metro or train you check in and out at the station (platform).

Amsterdam Beach & Haarlem

Bus 80 (Connexion): Amsterdam Beach Line

Route: Amsterdam Elandsgracht - Zandvoort Busstation

Bus 80, the Amsterdam Beach Line, takes you to the beautiful old city centre of Haarlem. Enjoy the beautiful

small streets and its picturesque houses. Or visit the Dutch first and oldest museum, open for public purposes since 1784; Teylers Museum. A visit to Teylers Museum is like a voyage through time, a voyage of discovery in the world of art and science.

Old Holland: Zaanse Schans & Industrial Heritage

Bus lines 800 and 801 (EBS/MEERPLUS) – Touristic Lines to Zaanse Schans, Edam, and Volendam

Line 800 runs between Amsterdam and the Zaanse Schans. This is a fast and direct connection — you'll be there in just 22 minutes!

Line 801 runs from Zaandam Station via Zaanse Schans and Purmerend to Volendam and Edam. Enjoy visiting traditional villages, windmills, cheese makers, and clog factories along the way. You can hop on and off at any stop, anytime.

Bus 391 (EBS): Industrial Heritage Line

A ride on bus 391, the Industrial Heritage Line, is well worth your time.

First stop: NDSM terrain. This former shipyard on the IJ river is bursting with creative activity.

Second stop: Zaandam Centre. The new renovated centre of Zaandam is perfect for shopping and relaxing.

Final stop: Zaanse Schans. Visit de Zaanse Schans with its Dutch wooden houses and windmills. Here you'll discover how the Dutch people used to live and work in the 17th and 18th centuries. Departure from Amsterdam Central Station.

Old Holland: Waterland & Smalltown Harbours

Smalltown Harbours Volendam, Edam, Marken, Hoorn and Monnickendam can be easily visited taking one of the frequent bus lines of EBS. Hop on and see how time stood still for several centuries.

Bus 305 (EBS) takes you (via Purmerend) to the Beemster. The Beemster reclaimed land is on the UNESCO's list of world heritage sites.

Bus 397 (Connexion)

Route: Schiphol Airport - Amsterdam Leidseplein/Elandsgracht

The Amsterdam Airport Express and NS trains provide a quick and easy transfer from Amsterdam Schiphol Airport to the city centre of Amsterdam.

The bus takes you directly to Concertgebouw, Museumplein or Leidseplein. From these bus stops you can get to many hotels very easily.

Bus 397 leaves from bus platform B17 in front of Schiphol Airport/Plaza.

Amsterdam City

Tram 2 (GVB)

Route: Central Station – Nieuw Sloten

Tram 2 will take you right through the highlights of the city centre. Use the tram stop Dam for the Royal Palace. At the bustling Leidseplein stop you will find cinemas, bars, restaurants and theatres. Finally visit one of the many museums at stop Museumplein. In front of Central Station tram 2 departs on the 'B' side.

Tram 14 (GVB)

Route: Central Station – Muiderpoortstation

Tram 14 will take you right through the city centre of Amsterdam to the famous Rembrandtplein with cinemas, bars, restaurants and clubs. This line can also be used for the H'ART Museum at tram stop Waterloooplein. Tram 14 also stops close to Artis Royal Zoo at stop Artis. Tram 14 departs in front of Central Station on the "A" side.

Tram 24 (GVB)

Route: Central Station – VU Medisch Centrum

Tram 24 will take you to the Museum Quarter with Van Gogh Museum, Rijksmuseum and Stedelijk Museum. Change to tram 25 at Roelof Hartplein to visit the bustling De Pijp district with the Albert Cuyp market. Tram 24 departs in front of Central Station on the "B" side.

Metro 52 (GVB)

Route: Noord – Central Station – Zuid

Metro 52, also known as the North-South line, is an attraction in itself. The metro takes you in only 16 minutes from Station Noord, via the city centre to Station Zuid. At each metro station you can find an art project. Get off at station Vijzelgracht for the Museum Quarter and at Europaplein for the RAI Conference Centre.

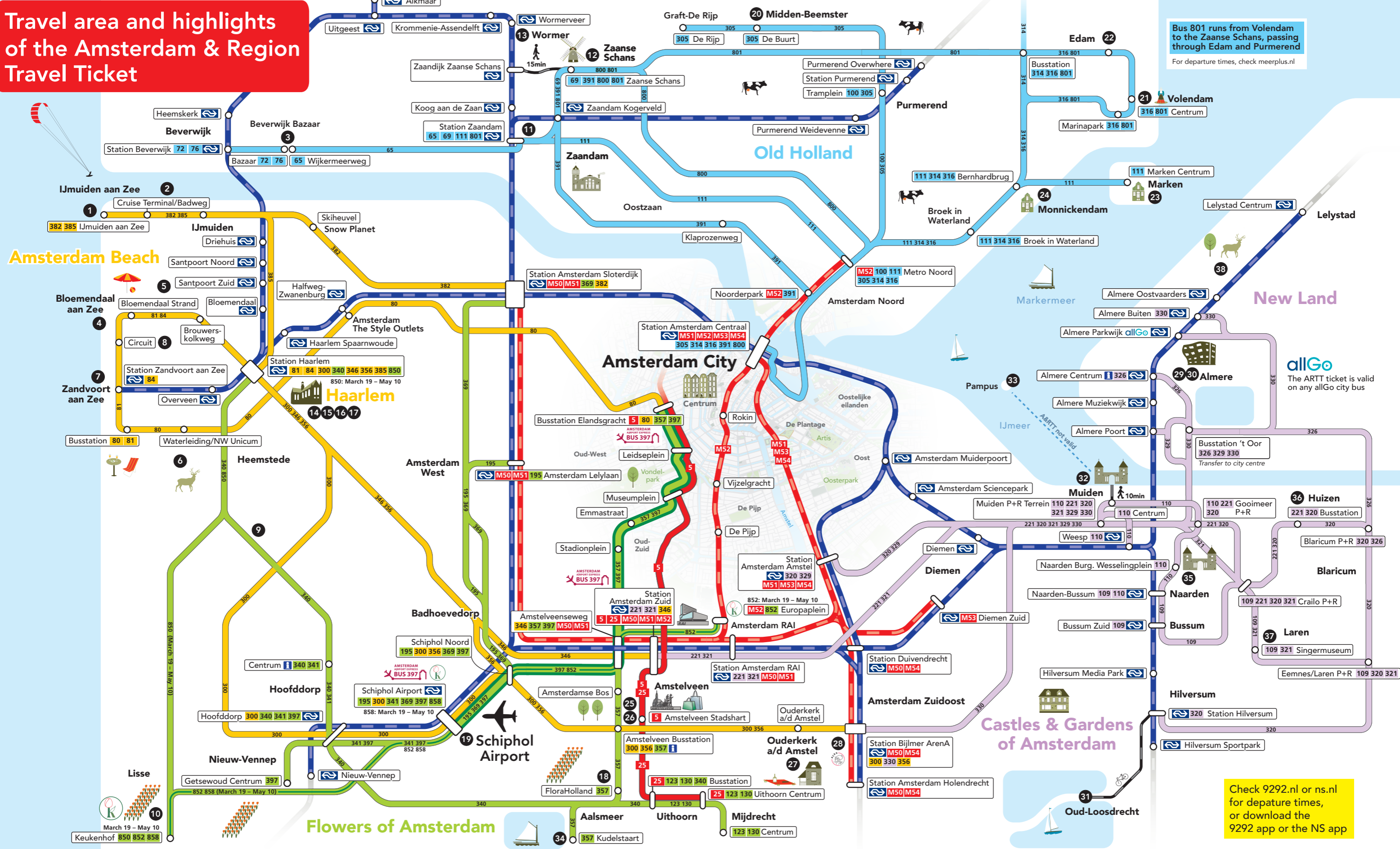
